**COMMUNITY WORKSHOP  
DEVELOPING A VISION FOR CUMMINGS PARK**  
The Ngaio Crofton Downs Residents Association is seeking input from the community to develop a vision for Cummings Park in the centre of Ngaio.

The first step is a workshop in the Ngaio Town Hall between 2pm and 4pm on Saturday 31 October. The aim is to generate ideas and gauge community preferences about future possibilities for Cummings Park prior to preparing a draft vision.

Currently the park contains a playground, a picnic lawn and areas of regenerating native bush. The Korimako stream runs through the park, as does the national Te Araroa walkway.

We believe Cummings Park has the potential to meet the needs of our community by better providing for a range of informal recreation activities for all age groups.

A community vision would strengthen the ability of local residents to effectively engage in partnership with the Wellington City Council on issues relating to the park's future.

The workshop will be facilitated by local residents who work professionally in landscape architecture and urban design. It will start with a short presentation at 2pm which sets the context for the project. A series of facilitated group discussions will follow.

You are encouraged to stay from the beginning if you can, but otherwise we hope you will drop in and let us know your views about Cummings Park, or email them to us at [ngaioipa@gmail.com](mailto:ngaioipa@gmail.com)

ANNUAL REPORT FOR 2015**  
We had an eventful and fruitful year which included making submissions to the Wellington City Council and supporting the initiatives of three independent community groups.

**WCC RESERVES MANAGEMENT PLAN**  
We made a substantial submission to Council on the draft Reserves Management Plan which we generally supported. While no substantial changes were made as a result of our submission, we did attract attention when we spoke on the submission to Councillors. As a result four Councillors visited both Cummings Park and Chelmsford Park with members of our Committee. Possibilities for the future development of both parks were discussed.

**WCC DRAFT BIODIVERSITY STRATEGY &  
ACTION PLAN**  
We made a brief submission on this, focussing on the need for better signage in areas where fledging native birds were at risk. This followed the killing of a fledgling kaka last summer by an off-leash dog in Huntleigh Park.

**PARTNERSHIPS WITH COMMUNITY  
GROUPS**  
We were delighted to be associated with construction of the Silversky track (from Silverstream Road to the Skyline track) led by a group of mainly Crofton Downs residents.

This initiative has significantly added to options for walking and biking in our local environment.

Ngaio resident Kathleen Wright and a team including Reed Wade and Diana Dallas from Crofton Downs created an enterprise hub in Johnsonville Mall where people who work from home can share facilities and ideas. "Sub Urban Co-Working" ([www.suburban.org.nz](http://www.suburban.org.nz)) was launched in

September at its site near the Mall food court. We are pleased to be one of many who helped the team achieve a great outcome on a shoestring budget.

We were also pleased to support Crofton Downs residents concerned about the proposal to fast-track housing development at 131 Silverstream Road. Residents were, with our support, successful in ensuring that normal RMA procedures were to be followed for the development. The Wellington City Council has, however, decided against publicly notifying the earthworks resource consent application for the development, and the consent has now been granted.

**PEOPLE**  
Robin White, the current chairperson of the NCDRA, withdrew from active involvement in June through illness. Our secretary, Nick Watson, resigned in June as he was moving from Ngaio. The loss of both Robin and Nick has left large holes on our Committee.

We hope to remedy this by attracting new people to put their names forward at the coming AGM, either as officers or members of the Committee.
